In fact, the memorable occasion was not only attended by Council members, parents, teachers and students, but also by countless past presidents of the Alumni Association. Equally joyful was the full resumption of classes on 25<sup>th</sup> October after almost two years of half-day, hybrid and online schooling. As soon as the Education Bureau announced that schools whose vaccination rate reaches 70% may revert to a whole-day timetable, the administration team worked tirelessly to encourage staff and students to get vaccinated against COVID-19 and spent days updating and consolidating data. We were among the first five schools in Hong Kong to be able to offer afternoon classes to S6 students. When this arrangement was extended to the entire school, it was met with great enthusiasm from parents, teachers and students alike (though some of our boys and girls were a little tired on the first two days!). Words cannot describe how glad I am to have teachers who are so dedicated to providing the best for our students.

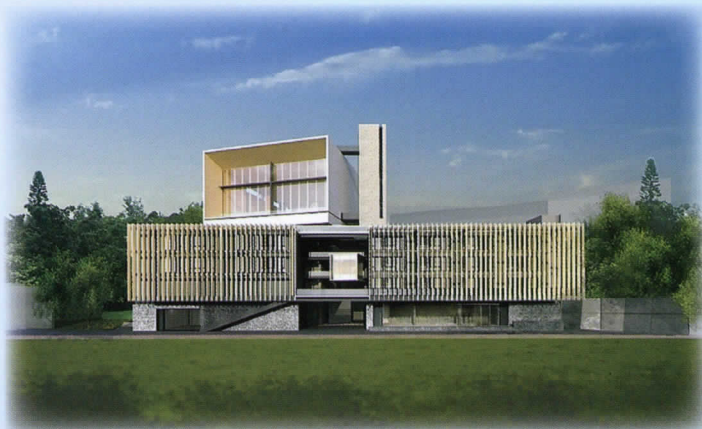

## Benevolence House



We are delighted to announce that the new Academic Building to be completed in 2022 will be named Benevolence House (尚善樓). The name was chosen in line with the College's mission to inculcate in students a strong sense of moral and spiritual integrity. The Chinese name alludes to the Confucian classic *The Great Learning*, or *Da Xue*, which says: 'What the Great Learning teaches, is to illustrate illustrious virtue; to renovate the people; and to rest in the highest excellence'. The English word 'benevolence' can be traced back to two Latin words: *bene*, which means 'good', and *velle*, which means 'to wish'. 'Benevolence' therefore reflects our earnest hope that our boys and girls will 'do good' and be upright individuals with the highest moral standards.

### 「尚善樓」命名隨想

尚字，尊崇、崇尚之意。尚、上二字古為通解，故尚字亦有上之意。

六經以「書經」為古，故稱「尚書」，所謂記上古之書也，亦有最上級、最重要之意，論語云：「好仁者，無以尚之」，以仁為尚，此之謂也。

善字，從字形結構上而言，從「羊」、「言」聲。古代「羊」即「祥和」，故祥和之言，就是佳言善語。中國儒家提出人性本善，是以善是人們品德之源，孔子論仁，孟子論四端，均歸結到人的「善性」本體。

「尚善」一詞，從靜態而言，可指人之最上佳的善良本德；從動態而言，可指人尊崇、追求至善的渴求。《大學》中有「大學之道，在明明德，在新（親）民，在止於至善」，指出明德修己的終極目標就是「止於至善」。

Dr Raymond Ch'ien (Chairman of the College Council), Mr Tung Chee-chen (Vice Chairman of the College Council) and Professor Frederick Leung (Supervisor) were among the many distinguished guests who attended the ceremony. 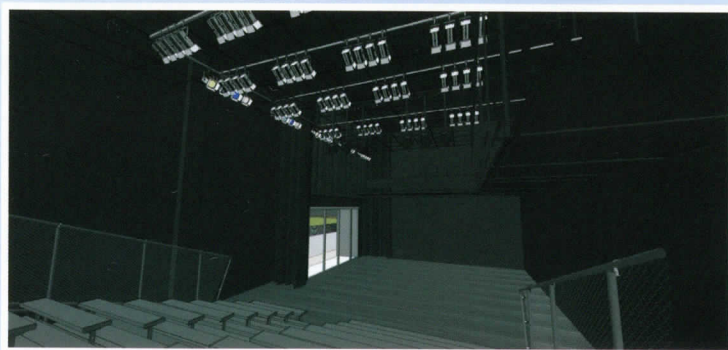




## 'Inherit and Innovate' Fundraising Project

# HKDSE and IBDP Results and University Offers

Among all the S6 students who sat the HKDSE and IBDP in 2021, 90% received bachelor's degree offers; 54% are pursuing their studies in Hong Kong while 46% are pursuing their studies overseas. Out of the 45 students in the IBDP, three students obtained the maximum score of 45, five students 44, three students 43, and half of our students obtained 40 marks or more. In all 16 subjects that our school entered for the HKDSE, the SSC Level 5+ percentage is higher than that of all the candidates in Hong Kong. Compared to the previous year, there has been massive improvement in 11 of the subjects. Thanks to all the teachers, students and parents for their hard work.

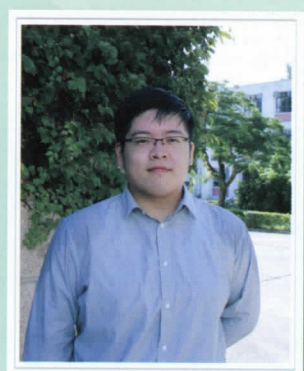

## Staff Development Day 1

The first Staff Development Day this year was held on 21<sup>st</sup> September 2021. Mr Patrick Yuen helped to conduct an IT Workshop for teachers and Mr Theodore Tam shared his experience in using Microsoft Forms. Then, teachers were split into groups for class teacher workshops. Most were very positive about this session on effective class management.

After a short break, Ms Grace Tse from the Education University of Hong Kong delivered a talk on how to handle students with Attention Deficiency and Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD). Apart from introducing theories, she also made use of experiential learning and conducted some games for teachers. An overwhelming majority of teachers were able to acquire some understanding of ADHD and the techniques to cater for these students' needs.

The last section of the Staff Development Day was a sharing session for individual Key Learning Areas (KLAs). Chinese teachers attended a talk entitled 'Catering for Learning Diversity in the Chinese Curriculum' by an educational psychologist, in which they discussed specific methods in helping students with diverse needs cope with the demands of their curriculum.

We at St Stephen's treasure every opportunity for students to learn about the real world they will be a big part of very soon. Special thanks once again to the Alumni Association for making this happen!



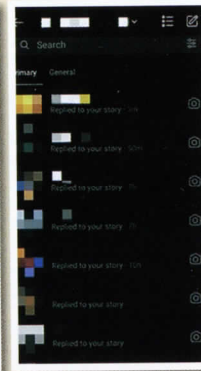
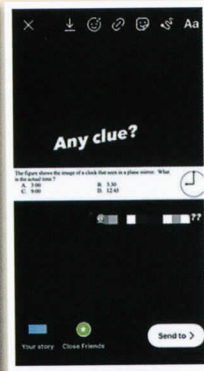


## STEM Awards

Our young engineers 5Y Yeung Andy Chi Chun and 6C Chan Long Hin Geoff have won the "Pandemic Innovative Digital Solution Awards 2020", "HKIE ITD InnoTech competition 2021", "Best Implementation Solution Award (Senior Form)" and "Best Performance School Grand Award". These extraordinary achievements highlight not only their expertise in technology, but also their strong sense of social responsibility and desire to make our lives better.

The coronavirus outbreak has affected all segments of our community. Learning and teaching saw one of the biggest challenges of the century. With social distancing in place, the learning community and its underlying relationships were seriously undermined. Meanwhile, to our young engineers, this outbreak has created a huge opportunity for them to reshape our ways of interacting with each other. Modern technology has in many aspects enabled our students to propose and implement IT solutions to help maintain and revamp human connections necessary for education. In light of the above, Andy and Geoff created an educational mobile app to tackle the unfavourable effects brought to us by the pandemic. Their app is powered by artificial intelligence that selects suitable materials for learners of any skill level. It also features a leaderboard to motivate learners to improve and compete in a virtual environment. To further promote communication and collaboration in the pandemic,

our two engineers included in the app the capability to share difficult questions on Instagram for discussion. Moreover, there are simple but compelling statistics which help students to identify key areas requiring improvement and teachers to evaluate the efficacy of teaching at a glance.

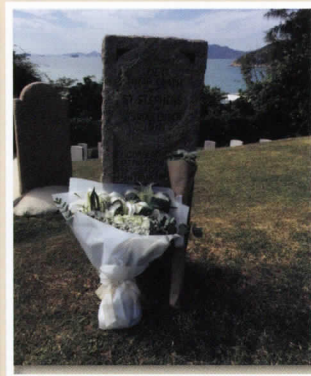

## CUHK-HKJC AI for the Future Scheme

We are happy to announce that our College has been selected as one of the 17 Affiliate Schools in Year 3 (2021-2022) for the CUHK-HKJC AI for the Future project among 80 applicants. The project brings together the strong expertise of the CUHK Engineering and Education faculties to create a new AI curriculum, a sustainable AI education model and relevant supporting infrastructure to establish a conducive ecosystem in AI education for Hong Kong's secondary schools.

As an Affiliate School, the College will be able to access and adopt the curriculum and courseware developed by experts in the industry. The curriculum will be incorporated in S2 and S3 Computer and Information Technology lessons in the upcoming semester.



## ICT Outing

S4 and S5 ICT (Information and Communication Technology) students visited the AI Education and Exploration Lab at the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK), and took a tour of the Hong Kong Science and Technology Park (HKSTP). They were introduced to one of the many projects on display – the CUHK-JC iCar. It was an intriguing demonstration of how robots can use Artificial Intelligence (AI) in teaching itself to make decisions, and carry out tasks such as driving along any drawn lines. Our students also learnt how to program AI to tackle daily-life problems. Under the guidance of the lab lecturers and our teachers, they coded a program to distinguish between different species of birds. The tour of HKSTP gave us a glimpse of Hong Kong's own thriving technological ecosystem. Home to more than 1000 enterprises, Hong Kong possesses numerous elites in the field of technology and innovation. They help push the city beyond its limits and consolidate its status as a technological hub of Asia. Of all the exhibits, Virtual Reality offered the most profound experiences to students. It allowed them to immerse themselves in exploring the limitless possibilities that the future holds for them.
