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A Principal with a Vision and a Heart to Serve: A Chat with Ms Carol Yang

‘If I were to be graded on my performance as Principal of St Stephen’s College, I believe I would score a pass!’ That is what Ms Carol Yang said as the interview began. Many in the school community would, however, disagree vehemently. Since she took the helm in 2011, Ms Yang has done more for the College than anyone could have imagined. SSC first offered the IBDP in 2015 as an IB World School, kickstarting the ‘dual curricula’ that have been in place at the senior secondary level ever since. Other highlights include the construction of Benevolence House (2022), as well as the repurposing of Leung Kau Kui Student Centre as an ‘IB Building’ (2017).

From Day 1, Ms Yang’s goal has been to uphold the time-honoured vision of the College. That vision consists in the cultivation of all-rounded students who are not only capable learners but also possess remarkable talent in music, sports and the arts. ‘When people look back on my tenure, they may talk about the expansion of campus facilities, the IB and so on. But these were not undertakings in themselves; what I cared about was how they would contribute to our educational ideals,’ Ms Yang explained. This is indeed epitomised by the state-of-the-art Benevolence House, a stunning edifice complete with an indoor gym and Black Box Theatre (to be named after her) that open up an infinite array of learning opportunities. How about academic results? ‘It’s a balancing act,’ the retiring Principal said, taking her time to find the right words. ‘I am proud of all the hard work our teachers and students put in.’ In fact, under Ms Yang’s stewardship, the College has seen a steady improvement in academic attainment: one HKDSE graduate (2014) obtained seven Level 5** and six IBDP graduates (three in 2018 and three in 2021) achieved the maximum score of 45. What she emphasised, time and time again, was that simple message: she would do anything to boost SSC students’ results, on condition that their all-round development was well taken care of.

The job of a Principal is, of course, not without its challenges. The sheer size of the College, both in terms of the physical campus and the staff, meant that Ms Yang effectively was, in her words, a ‘CEO’ of a small ‘enterprise’, to whom nearly 200 teaching and non-teaching staff report. Her list of administrative work was endless: HKDSE and IBDP dual-track system, curricular alignment with the Preparatory School, liaison with parents and alumni, boarding facilities and heritage conservation are but a few items. How did she cope? ‘Work is a priority, but so is my sanity!’ Ms Yang laughed. While she described herself as ‘jovial by nature’, she admitted that she had to make an effort to achieve work-life balance. She made it a rule that she would not bring any documents home despite living on campus. She limited external work-related dinner engagements to at most once per week. She also kept her hobby – watching plays – very much alive.

Throughout her illustrious career at three Sheng Kung Hui schools as an Economics teacher, Guidance Mistress, Vice Principal and finally Principal, spanning 45 years, Ms Yang always valued above anything her relationships at work. 'To be frank, out of all the roles I have taken on, I enjoyed being Guidance Mistress most,' she recalled, 'because I was friends with many students, particularly those who were emotionally vulnerable.'

To her, it is crucial for teachers to remind themselves of why they joined the profession in the first place: 'If you are willing to walk with young people, you will eventually reap great rewards – after all, what students achieve is testament to the education they received.' Through her frequent interactions with pupils at St Stephen's, she has come to be impressed by their outgoing personality and strong communication skills. 'While they tend to play harder than they work, especially in the junior forms, most do care about their studies, and they gradually become very self-disciplined in the senior forms,' she added. She hopes that every boy and girl would seize as many opportunities as possible, starting from taking the initiative to learn from their teachers, who she feels are part of a highly qualified and dedicated team. 'The teaching staff at SSC are not just professional; with a considerable number living in staff quarters, the sense of community is exceedingly strong,' she exclaimed. She will never forget, for example, teachers of this 'second home' looking out for her and other colleagues amid the tumultuous waves of COVID-19. 'You know what? Some would make bulk purchases so that everyone would have a stable supply of necessities!'

'I will stay in Hong Kong, but much of my time will be spent travelling around the world,' Ms Yang's eyes lit up as she laid out her retirement plans. Besides globetrotting, Ms Yang is also thinking about learning a new language, watching a lot of plays and perhaps working as a volunteer counsellor, 'so that I won't get Alzheimer's!' Let us all wish Ms Yang, the Principal who deserves an A+ but is humble enough to only award herself a pass, a long, happy and rewarding retirement. Her contributions will be remembered for years to come.

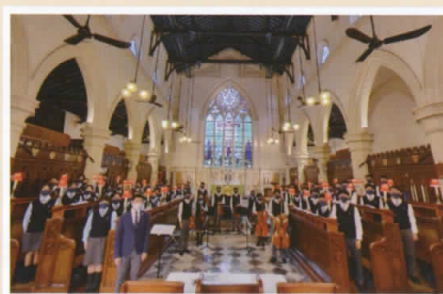

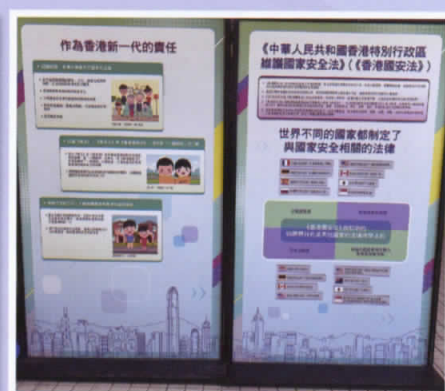

Transforming Worries through Mindfulness Workshop

At SSC, in the multifunction room, a dozen students sat in chairs in a half-circle, silent, feet on the floor, eyes closed. BACP Registered Psychological therapist, Ms Alice Chan, spoke softly.

It's 'Transforming Worries through Mindfulness Workshop' for S5 students, where Alice used resources from the Jockey Club's 'Peace and Awareness' Mindfulness Culture in Schools Initiative (JC PandA) to teach students to meditate.

Research showed Hong Kong students today deal with high levels of stress, anxiety, and depression, and mindfulness helps ease those conditions. Also, it may help boost resilience in adolescents via better cognitive performance and emotional regulation.

"Today, we're going to understand our tendency to worry, recognise the physical response to worry, know what mindfulness is and learn some mindfulness exercises to deal with worry!" Alice told the students.

The workshop allowed participants to take a break from stress and worries. They craved quietness through the Mindfulness exercise, and it helped them focus on their inner selves.

"Take a good deep breath in, feel your weight sink into the chair on the out-breath...."

"And after the final ring of the chime..."

"Follow the sound of the tone."

Diiiiiiiiiiiiiiiiing.

...it's back to their day.

We should be grateful for such small things as a hot shower and a decent bed to sleep on.

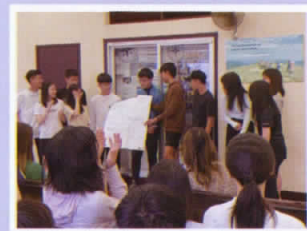

Outward Bound is a journey that I will surely remember for the many years to come. To me, the experience can be divided into three stages: **Suffer, Survival and Satisfaction.**

Suffer: To say that the whole journey was exhausting would be an understatement. The journey was challenging both physically and mentally. We had to kayak in the open sea of Sai Kung for 4 consecutive days and controlling the direction and speed of the kayak was arduous as the wind would very easily disrupt our progress. Navigating through the natural terrain of Pak Tam Chung on foot was also extremely tiring. As it was raining on the day of our hiking trip, we had to carefully maintain our balance while navigating through a sea of slippery leaves. I had to walk through this dangerous path while carrying the food bag which contained everyone's lunch. It was terrifying as I suddenly realised that I had to bear huge responsibility if anything happened to the food. Trying to maintain one's balance on a slippery road while carrying a heavy bag was quite daunting. Fortunately, I made it to the destination. All these were physically demanding. Furthermore, we could not shower at all during the entire journey and it was really uncomfortable. Besides, living in an unfamiliar environment was also very difficult. Sleeping on the hard floor with one's body being soaked in water due to rainwater seeping in from a heavy rainstorm, one could not help but hope that Outward Bound would be over soon. All these proved to be mental torture for us all.

Survival: While we suffered quite a lot throughout the whole journey, all this suffering helped us accumulate invaluable knowledge of survival. Throughout the whole journey, we had to cook nearly all our meals. Our culinary skills were put to the test, but in the end we were able to prepare a delicious feast for 13 people with simple ingredients. (We were fortunate that we didn't have to eat bread with Aquarius powder!) We learnt how to build a tent. We also learnt how to use kayaks as our only source of transportation. These lessons have gifted me with the necessary survival skills and I feel grateful for that.

Satisfaction: We struggled through our whole journey, yet we gained priceless knowledge of survival along the way. This to me was satisfying, knowing that all suffering meant something and eventually paid off. My ability to survive the 5-day trip with the unfavourable environmental conditions already made me feel proud of myself. Throughout the journey, I further polished my communication skills by frequent interactions with my groupmates. The most unforgettable moment of the trip was when I jumped off the pier at the Outward Bound Base. I remembered walking on the narrow ledge and looking down at the seawater, which looked far away below me. I felt really nervous at first and my senses became numb. It felt like my life was hanging on a thread. But in the end, I decided to embrace the challenge and jumped into the sea, backed by nothing but sheer confidence.



All in all, while this trip had its ups and downs, I was immensely proud to have gone through this process of self-discovery. By frequently encouraging me to face challenges, instructors provided me with the chance to interrogate myself and fully understand who I am. For instance, jumping off the pier wasn't mandatory, but I was advised to confront my own fears and complete the task. And by doing so, I was given the opportunity to step out of my comfort zone and realise that I am capable of making such accomplishments.

我步入禮堂，「體香」撲鼻，見孩子們蓬頭垢面，與平日上學時清秀的面孔相比，簡直判若兩人。雖則如此，他們的小組分享妙語連珠，令人忍俊不禁：每天穿破爛的水鞋，吃混入海沙的三文治、罐頭伴飯，睡在牛糞堆旁邊的漏水營幕。四天沒有洗澡，又因天氣惡劣，已經「乾濕不分」，完全沒有動力去更衣及梳頭。其中一位同學饒有智慧地分享道：「我曾問自己，為何要付錢來過這樣糟糕的日子，放棄家裏舒適安逸的生活？但此時此刻，我覺得得到比付出更多，這個訓練營是值得回票價的。」

我感覺這五天的經歷，對他們來說，應該有不少的衝擊，也令他們的言行有些微妙的變化。我們作為父母，看到的是拖着疲乏身軀的「邋遢」少年，但他們眼睛閃閃發亮、炯炯有神，似乎靈魂深處被喚醒了！兒子回到家中喋喋不休地告訴我這幾天的行程，也很認真地說，那幾天彷彿清空了他平日的學習壓力，也了解自己的另一面，感到很滿足。

我們的下一代，加油吧！再次感謝學校的細意安排！

An Interview with Professor Robert Banks and Mrs Linda Banks

St Stephen's College had the absolute pleasure of welcoming Professor Robert Banks, and his wife, Mrs Linda Banks, who came all the way from Australia to Hong Kong in April. The couple wrote a book about the Stewart family called *Children of the Massacre*. One of the children was actually the second principal of St Stephen's College, The Reverend Arthur Dudley Stewart. We conducted an interview with the writers who gave us some insights on pieces of historic events and their advice for SSCers.

Children of the Massacre is a book about six remarkable missionary journeys of the children of the Stewart family. In August 1895, four members of the Stewart family, including Mr and Mrs Stewart, their 5-year-old child and their baby were killed at the Kucheng Massacre, leaving six Stewart children behind. The eldest child was Arthur Dudley Stewart, the second principal of SSC (1914-1915). The children grew up in the United Kingdom and one by one returned to Asia to serve.

When asked if the Stewart parents made the right decision going to China to serve God, which eventually led to the death of themselves and two of their children, Professor Banks said that the parents did not know that they would die, although they did know that they would suffer. Mrs Banks added that the Stewart couple came to China to spread the gospel to the people. The message of the gospel is very important so it was worth it. Professor Banks also mentioned the six surviving Stewart children learnt to be forgiving and thought if the children were still alive, they would probably say "It's okay mom and dad, we forgive you and we understand."

Writing a book, especially a family biography, requires a great deal of research, and a lot of memorable moments will certainly come along the way. For Professor Banks and Mrs Banks, it has got to be when they and their Chinese friends went up to the mountain where the Kucheng Massacre happened and reflected on what happened. The weather that day was a little rainy, and what surrounded the group was the burnt foundations of the buildings. The group sang some Christian songs and read some prayers together. It was then that the couple felt a deep connection with the Stewarts, and were 'emotionally charged'.

Considering that photographs weren't common back then, let alone audio or video recordings, the Banks began their research by accessing the Church Missionary Society's online archive, where they found reports, letters and more articles about the Stewarts, which made them believe it was possible to piece out the story. They found the online archives of St Stephen's College and St Paul's College, and they found even more photographs and historical descriptions of events, including online access to excerpts of *Chimes*! Another major turning point was when Michael Stewart, one of the surviving children, got in touch with them. He gave them more material about the massacre.

Mrs Banks believes that having good values and attitudes is indeed important for teenagers, so she would like to encourage everyone to keep doing what they are doing, and treasure the wonderful legacy that has been left to us by people who laid down their lives and worked hard. She reminded SSCers to be grateful for all fabulous teachers and staff that are around them and to be passionate about the good work they are doing.

(Persons-in-charge: Mr Theodore Tam, Mr Clinton Chong, Ms Erica Hung)

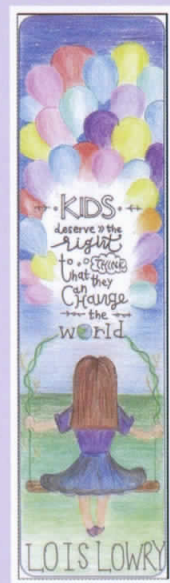

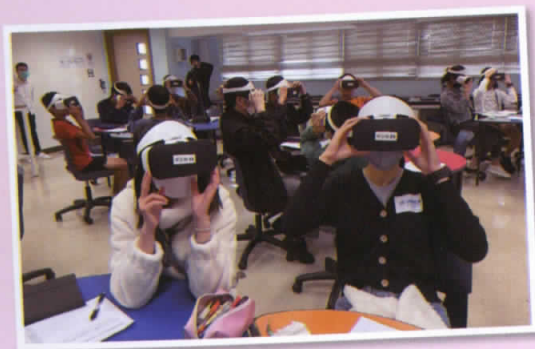

Christian Fellowship Holds Winter Overnight Camp after Three-Year Hiatus

After a long hiatus due to the pandemic, the Christian Fellowship of our College held its highly anticipated winter overnight camp, H2O Camp, in January 2023. The event took place at both the College and Y Loft Youth Square, drawing thirty participants from different ages and backgrounds.

The theme of this year's camp was "Fill My Cup," which aimed to explore how Jesus' living water, as promised in John 4:14, can quench our spiritual thirst and overflow to bless others. The camp kicked off with a team-building game designed by our students, which challenged the participants to complete various tasks around the school campus within a limited time.

The camp concluded with Mr Wu calling for a new generation of Jesus witnesses in St Stephen's College, and nearly all the students responded to the call. The participants expressed gratitude for the chance to grow spiritually and connect with their peers in a meaningful way after a long period of isolation.

S3 Scientific Investigation Project

The 2022-23 S3 Scientific Investigation Project (SIP) aimed to encourage students to actively explore the areas of science that interest them. They were required to use the scientific approach and demonstrate such skills as observation, hypothesising, experimental design, data processing and drawing conclusions. On completion of the project, they presented their plans and experimental findings verbally to teachers and other students on 15th May.

A total of 25 different scientific investigations were completed this year. Examples of topics included essential oils in the growth of fungus, the changes in cooling effect when bottles of different sizes were used and the optimum conditions for crystal formation. Some students extended their investigations in response to current issues. For example, a group sought to identify a more effective way to degrade polypropylene, the major component of the face masks which are being disposed of in great numbers amid the global pandemic. In addition to investigative studies, we also appreciated how scientific understanding of various fields are put together to create new products, e.g. a prototype of a mobile office backpack.

A big thank you to all the science teachers for the guidance and support, and to all S3 young scientists for making this a memorable experience.
